Tenure-track Assistant/Associate Professor in Teacher Education

Lehigh University's College of Education seeks an emerging or established scholar and teacher educator for a tenure-track faculty position at the assistant or associate professor rank. Additionally, the new faculty member will have the opportunity to work with doctoral students, collaborate with nationally ranked faculty pursuing similar research agendas within the College and University, and be active in our Integrated Professional Development Schools partnership.
