

Assistant Professor in Applied Behavior Analysis (Psychology)

The Department of Psychology at Queens College of the City University of New York (CUNY) announces two tenure track positions at the level of Assistant Professor beginning in the Fall of 2008. Candidates must have a Doctoral degree specializing in Psychology, Applied Behavior Analysis or a closely-related field. Preference will be given to candidates who (a) have a record or potential of attracting extramural research funding, (b) have research experience in applied behavior analysis, and (c) will complement, or broaden, current strengths of the Learning Processes and Behavior Analysis (LPBA) program. The LPBA Doctoral Subprogram in Psychology of the City University of New York is well known for its strengths in research and training in behavior analysis. The candidate is expected to participate in the LPBA program, the Queens College Masters Degree and Certificate Programs in Applied Behavior Analysis, and the undergraduate Psychology program at Queens College. The candidate will be expected to establish a program of empirical research.

Candidates should submit a letter of application stating their research and academic qualifications, training, and goals; a curriculum vitae; sample publications, and arrange for at least three current letters of recommendation to be sent to the Applied Behavior Analysis in Psychology Search Committee, Department of Psychology, Queens College, CUNY, 65-30, Kissena Blvd., Flushing, NY 11367-1567.
