

SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGY ASSISTANT/ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR

The Division of Psychology in Education of Arizona State University's Mary Lou Fulton College of Education seeks to hire a tenure-track professor at the assistant or associate level for its APA-accredited program in School Psychology. The appointment begins in August, 2008. Responsibilities include teaching courses, conducting research, and supervising students' research and field experiences. Specific areas of research, teaching, and practice are open. Members of the School Psychology faculty are Marley Watkins, Training Director, Linda Caterino, David Wodrich, and, beginning January 2008, George Hynd, who will serve as Dean of the College.

Required qualifications are a doctoral degree from a School Psychology program and a record of scholarship, teaching, and securing external funding appropriate to rank. Desired qualifications are eligibility for Arizona psychology licensure, applied experience in School Psychology or related area, and potential for promoting the program's interest in diversity within a scientist/practitioner model.

Application deadline is November 5, 2007, or every two weeks thereafter, until the search is closed. A vita, letter of application that explicitly addresses each required and desired qualification, two representative publications, and three letters of reference are required. Letters of reference must clearly speak to the applicant's teaching and scholarship. Send all material to David L.
