- Introduction -

In presenting this Genealogy, after forty-three years of research and personal contacts with several hundred members of the family throughout the United States and England, it is pertinent to review the history of and other information pertaining to its inception.

Starting in 1910, interest was aroused by the chance perusal of some early history of several family members found in the Carnegie Library at Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. A short time later, while on a business trip in the east, a distant relative was met who was keenly interested, and urged that the family be traced. For two years research was pursued intermittently because of business demands, but by the fall of 1912 the family had been traced to the first American ancestor, Philip Packer. Here a barrier was encountered, and the decision was made to obtain the English ancestry by going to England, where the visit lasted twenty-six months. On another trip to England and the continent in 1903, and another in 1909 on the ill-fated ship 'Lusitania,' genealogy was entirely unknown to the compiler.

At this time most of the records in England had not been indexed, and to obtain data it was necessary to screen thousands of sources to gain the material desired. During this process, one of our kinsmen, Thomas Packer, of London and Essex, was most helpful in providing special courtesies without the usual fees at a number of sources. The services of a translator were required for the Latin found in many historical articles of ancient times.

On a spring morning the trip of some fifty miles was made by train to our old estate at Groombridge, near Tunbridge Wells, in Kent, then in the occupancy of the maiden daughter of the late Reverend John Saint. To trod these grounds and wander through the large rooms and halls of this fine old mansion, with evidences of our ancestors all about, aroused not only enchantment, but a deep regard for those who once so happily lived here. This was the birthplace of Philip Packer and his father. In the chapel nearby we find the graves of Philip Sr. and some of his family beneath large slabs in the floor. Elsewhere in this volume Groombridge is more fully treated.

This journey was followed by others - the next being to Donnington Castle, near Newbury, Berks, where the visit was made more pleasant by a short stay at Donnington Castle House, or Packer Farm, just below the Castle. The Gate house and the Castle are open to the public, and like Groombridge, contain mementos of the family and the Civil War.

From this point a trip was made by private coach to Shellingford, with brief stops at Oxford, Lambourne and Chieveley, the latter place being the seat of the Lamborn family, related by marriage to the Packer family. At Shellingford only the church remains, the Castle having been torn down. In this church, which was rebuilt by John, the father of Philip Packer, we find the burial places of several of the family, with both mural and floor memorial tablets. Time did not permit tracing the history of Shellingford Castle. At Oxford University an ancient Packer Pedigree by Sir Thomas Packer and the enrollment of many of the family were found.

Returning to America just before the start of the first World War, with his branch of the family traced to original sources, the compiler was induced to include the records of all family members throughout the United States and an undertaking involving research in many States and great personal expense. Here, the great difficulties seemed insurmountable, due to the nineteenth century migrations to the 'New Country,' Western Pennsylvania and Ohio, and later spreading to Indiana, where the town of Packerton was founded, and to Michigan, Illinois, Iowa, Missouri, Texas, Arkansas, Utah, Idaho, Arizona, California and other States.

On account of remoteness the records of these branches were difficult to obtain, many requiring twenty years or more. Complications arose from the repeated use of christian names by descendants of the New England branches of John and Thomas Packer, and Samuel Packer, whose sons changed their name to Packard, and of which a

few were found to have changed back to Packer one hundred years later. Others had migrated from England in the 19th century. There were also some rather interesting experiences. One, a Russian Jew, adopted our name because it was the English meaning of his Russian name. And another was given the name because he was abandoned by his parents and found on Packer Street in Brooklyn, New York. On one of many trips to the south, a directory in Alabama listed two Packers, and a call brought a surprise. Two brothers operated a tailoring and dry cleaning business, and they were negroes. Their parents were slaves on the Packer Plantation at Packer's Landing on the Alabama River, and after the Civil War they took the Packer name.

In making personal calls the compiler was always cordially received, and was encouraged by almost everyone. These visits led to compilation of local records by many, and finally resulted in the reunions since held in many States. Reunions are now held in Connecticut, Ohio, Iowa, Texas, Utah, Idaho, and in Arizona, where the large attendance of over 350 is attained by the Philip Packer Association, largely through the untiring efforts of Lillian Freestone Millett.

At least two other members of the family are amateur genealogists. The records of one, of the New England branch, only partially covered in this work, will be published by their Association. Most of these groups have heartily cooperated with the Packer Family Association, the parent body under the direction of your compiler.

No attempt has been made here to include all branches of the family or several hundred of the New England and various other lines, as this publication is primarily for those most concerned in the preservation of their lineage.

To reach this culmination a vast correspondence was necessary, there being some 1500 names and addresses on file from locations in almost every State, Canada, England, France, Australia, New Zealand and elsewhere. Rare and expensive books, papers, and pictures have been either purchased or donated, and the traveling and other expenses freely given by the compiler.

Starting on the Atlantic Coast in 1910, and ending on the Pacific Coast in 1953, with stops on the way, this volume, finally completed, is offered to the family with the assurance that the data herein contained is true and accurate to the best of the compiler's knowledge and belief.

Special acknowledgements are due to many of the family for either furnishing data, or naming the source from which it could be obtained. Notable among the elderly ladies were Araminta Packer Hoover, who, living in Little Rock, Ark., in 1918, when past 80 years of age, gave a store of early records, as did Edna Packer, of Alliance, Ohio, past eighty years of age in 1919. Most consistent and valuable help was given by Eleanor Packer (Allis) Wyeth, a granddaughter of Governor William Fisher Packer; and Leda Harrison, a granddaughter of John Pettit Packer, Sr., who has contributed a hand painted copy of the family Arms, and some very old original family documents. The Ohio and Iowa branches are indebted to Bert Packer, late of Akron, for the collection of many records up to the time of his passing. And the Arizona branch may be grateful to Lillian Freestone Millett. Many of the Idaho and Utah records were furnished by Mrs. Ossian L., and Earl and Estus Packer.

Incidental pre-publication expenses were offset by a large cash donation from Frank Gambill (Packer) Parker, as well as from Loren D. Packer and Lillian Freestone Millett.

Those who are interested will find it well worth while to visit the old Asa Packer mansion at Mauch Chunk, Pa., which is open to the public. While in that vicinity, Lehigh University, founded by Asa Packer, at South Bethlehem, should be visited, as should Packer Collegiate Institute at Brooklyn, New York. The oldest Packer homestead of the Philip line, is at Howard, near Lock Haven, Pa., the Charter for the land being from William Penn.

By request we are pleased to include in this work the Genealogy of the Wiltbank Family, through the officers of the Wiltbank Family Organization, and are

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proud to have them with us here, as well as through our blood ties in the Mendenhall ancestry. Their material was collected by Effie B. Wiltbank, Historian; Geneva P. Wiltbank, Genealogist; Eva Willami H. Ashcroft, on the Utah and Arizona lines, and Jane Lay Roundy and Sarah Ida Foremaster, for the Utah branches.

There are several variations of the Packer Arms, principally in the Crest, but the only Arms recorded in the College of Heralds were in the year 1623 to Thomas, grandfather of Philip Packer. The Packard family is not known to have used Arms until commercialized by the Packard Motor Company, and the origin of Samuel Packer has never been connected to the original grantee, Thomas Packer, or any of the Gloucestershire lines.

A sizeable group of Packer families were found living in northern North Carolina in 1790, origin unknown, who may have been descendants of those coming to Virginia with Captain John Smith, and no descendants have been found of Edward Packer, who came to Maryland in 1635.

That the results of this 'labor of love' will be a source of satisfaction to the family and also serve as a guiding light to the descendants of those having the honor and privilege of pioneering and aiding in the making of this great nation, is the wish of the compiler in presenting this volume.

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Johannes 'le Pakkere occurs as a tenant "in eadun Terciam (Lugdale) partem flod abbate (Sancta Augustina) 1253," as one of the holders of fees in Kent, England, in the 38th year of King Henry III, and
Walter 'le Pakkere occurs in a Hundred Roll of Bedfordshire as early as 1273 A. D.

Robert, son of William 'le Paker, quit claims land in Prestbury, in Cheshire, to the Abbey of St. Werburgh.

In a 'Pleas of the Crown,' at Bristol, Gloucestershire, of 1286 A.D., as we find from an Assize Roll of the 15th year of King Edward I., Matthew 'le Pakkere fined two maros for selling forty-six casks of wine.

In the 'Calendar of the Close Rolls,' 22nd year of King Edward I., June 1, 1294, Johannes 'le Pakkere acknowledges his indebtedness to the King in the sum of 20/4 (20 shillings, 4 pence), which amount is to be levied on his lands and chattels in Kent, in default of payment.

In the 'Calendar of the Patent Rolls,' 30th year of King Edward I., 1302 A.D., Dartford Commission of Oyer and Terminer to Roger Brabazon and Henry Sprigwell, touching an appeal which John, son of Thomas de Brenlaye, made before the justices of the King's bench by writ returnable before the latter fortnight after Easter next, and which as yet remains in the hands of the Sheriff of Kent, against John de Graveny, Gemoram, his wife, Thomas and Richard, his sons, Stephen de la Chapella, John 'le Packer, Thomas Abbott, of Canterbury, and other Works of that house, and Robert de Benghesh, for the death of Christian, son of Thomas de Brenlaye, his brother.

Gilbert de Dover, in the 34th year of King Edward I., 1305 A.D., appointed John 'le Packere, Baron of Sandwich, Kent, his proctor, to demand, recover and receive his goods which had been stolen and taken from him by land and sea since the true peace between the Kings of England and France.

From 'Acts of the Privy Council,' 2nd year of King Edward II, December 3, 1308, we find a grant at the request of Isabel, Queen of England, and John Wake, the King's cousin, to Simon 'le Packere, and other men of Spelding, and there dwelling, that they and their men in Spelding shall be quit of Paying toll, pavage, portage, stallage, lastage and murage for their own goods and merchandise in Spelding and all throughout Holland, excepting the town of Boston during the Fair of Boston.

The name occurs again in Gloucestershire in a Tallage Roll, Lay Subsidy, of the 6th year of King Edward II. 1312 A.D., as of Bristol, with one Richardus 'le Pakkere, habet in bonus 4 pounds.

Among assessments in Kent to Knight the Black Prince, 1346 A.D., Hundred of Downshamforde, we find - "De Abbate Soti pro dimido quod Johannes Packer (and other persons) tenant dimidium quartierum ut computum est per Inquisitionem XX5."

In a Chamberlain's account of Dover, Kent, 1365-67 A.D., we find - "to William Pakkere for carrying a letter to Folkestone for the men of Jernemuth IV d." Jernemuth Fair was held at Romene on Saints Simon and Jude Day.

In the Will of Walter Frompton, Burgess of Bristol, Gloucestershire, Dec. 6, 1388, reference is made to 'three shops in Murchstreet occupied by John Packer.'

In the Calendar of the Patent Rolls, Henry IV, 1410 A.D., Commission to the Mayor of Dartmouth, and John Hawley, to arrest, with others, Thomas Packer, and bring them before the King in Chancery in the Octave of Trinity next.

From a deed held by Anne (F.7) daughter of Lodowicke Packer, who died about 1674, and married July 16, 1633, John, son of Thomas Packer (F.6), of the Leigh and Ashton Keynes, we learn that certain properties were conveyed in 1551 to Thomas Packer (F.2), great grandfather of her husband, by Sir Anthony Packer.

The foregoing instruments indicate clearly that the name (Pakkere) Packer is derived from the occupation, and that it did not preclude landed possessions. In fact, one was styled Baron of Faversham, or Sandwich, Kent, and we

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show elsewhere that the family were landed gentry. At the same time, it is clear that all the families of this name did not descend from the same progenitor; nor have we the facilities for tracing the descent of these various Packers before the period when the name occurred as a surname. However, it is possible that these Packers of Gloucestershire were related, and that they were connected with John Packer, Bachelor of Laws, who was instituted incumbent to the free Chapel of Tookington, Gloucestershire, upon presentation of Sir Henry Berkeley, Knight, as appears from Bishop Morton's Register.

In the 'Acts of the Privy Council' of June 20, 1580, there is mentioned a letter to Thomas Packer, of Bristol, requesting him according to a process herewith sent him out of the Court of the Admiralty, to deliver unto the Portingale (Portuguese) Ambassador such goodes as do remayne in his possession, brought into the Realme by John Winter. This letter would indicate that he had some connection with the Admiralty, or was under its jurisdiction. It was, however, in his capacity of Clerk of the Signet Office that this order was issued. Warrants signed by the Queen and countersigned by the Secretary of State, or by the Lords of the Treasury, are called Signet Manuals. When so signed, the bill is styled a Signet Bill, and is taken to the Signet Office, where it remains on record. The offices of the Clerks of the Signet were abolished by statute in the XIV and XV year of Victoria, and the duties were directed to be performed in office of the Secretary of State for the Home Department. In the year 1590 a letter was addressed to Thomas Packer, Deputy Vice Admiral for the County of Somerset, dated at Windsor Sept. 13th, in the Acts of the Privy Council. Issue -

The merchants of Bristol, on Mar. 13, 1620, addressed a letter to Thomas Packer, Mayor, requesting him to urge the Council to accept 500 li. as their contribution against pirates

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
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

Moat House and St. Charles Chapel, Groombridge, Kent. England. F. 8.

Groombridge is a village rather below the heights of Rustall Common, its irregular but most picturesque red brick cottages standing amidst trees and overhanging ivy on the green slopes, from which to the left you can see the ancient church, which tells its own tale of bygone days. On its porch is an ancient Latin inscription, and within we find several memorials of the founder and his descendants. In the central panel of the large stained glass windows beneath the Packer Arms and Crest, we find the following - "To the Glory of God and to the memory of John Packer, of Groombridge Place, Esquire, the founder of this church, A. D. 1625." The left panel is a memorial to the King of France, who, as Duke of Orleans, was held a prisoner for several years in Moat House. Beneath his Arms and Crest we find - "Charles, Duke of Orleans, who, during his captivity at Groombridge, was a benefactor to the Parish Church, A. D. 1415."

At this time Moat House and the Manor of Groombridge were the property of Sir Richard Waller, and the right panel of the window is dedicated to his memory - "Sir Richard Waller, Knight, of Groombridge, by whom Charles, Duke of Orleans, was rescued at the Battle of Agincourt, A. D. 1415."

Very near the Chapel stands the gates and ornamental water of Groombridge Place. This house is replete with historic interest, which in itself represents a volume that well repays a friendly visit, but it is not a show house. Only a very cursory account may be given of this most beautiful old mansion, its gayest of old fashioned flower gardens, and its moss grown brick walls.

What is its history? In Saxon days it was called the Moated House, or Castle of Gromenbregge. An outer moat and an inner one surrounded it, the only way of access being its drawbridge. In the reign of King Henry III, 1217-56 A. D., this abode was in the possession of William Russell and his wife Haweis. They granted a charter of land for the building of the church. In the reign of King Edward I, 1239 to 1307, A. D., Henry de Cobham was its proprietor. Sir John de Clinton was its possessor in the reign of King Richard II, 1367 - 1400 A. D., and in the time of King Henry V, 1413-22 A. D., Richard Waller was its proprietor, and at that time the Duke of Orleans, taken at the Battle of Agincourt, was held captive for three hundred thousand marks ransom.

The old mansion was made fit for the reception of so distinguished a guest and was later rebuilt. But the old oak panelling still exists in the present house; it is beautifully carved with the linen pattern and surmounted by a frieze of scroll work terminating in dragon's heads; the Arms of France form one of the center panels, and the carved work on it is as clean and distinct as if it had just left the workman's hands.

For a long time the old mansion of Groombridge fell into decay, but was rebuilt by Philip Packer in John Evelyn's time, who was his great friend and companion, and we hear that Evelyn, describing the new building, wrote to a mutual friend that Philip had replaced the fine old house by an 'Italian Villa,' with many decorations; while other remarks from the same pen prove that Evelyn criticised rather severely the frivolity of his friend's taste. We suppose, however, that he forgave him, because he (Evelyn) planted two noble firs at the gate.

The date of the accession to the throne of King Charles II. is carved over the entrance to Groombridge; but the story of this moated house and some remains of its buildings are the heritage of an earlier foundation. The sight is one of extreme and almost sylvan beauty. Undulating park lands, having much of the characteristics in them of a Chace, lie round it. Fine trees in summer cast an antique shade. The moat which encircles it flows more freely than in some places of the kind, and wards from a noisy world not only the house itself but the pleasant expanses of an old world garden and the smooth area of well trimmed lawns.

An atmosphere of poetry breathes from surroundings which have inspired at different periods of history two of the inhabitants of the house. Charles, Duke of Orleans, courted the Muse here in the days of Agincourt, and must have found

the hours made lighter by the quiet and serenity of the spot. The lapse of one hundred and fifty years may have seen Edmund Waller, the poet of the Parliament, pacing garden and park-lands in one of his meditative rambles which gave birth to his lyrical outbursts. Groombridge may have given 'Go Lovely Rose' to a grateful world.

We cannot turn our back on this loveliest and most peaceful of homes without tendering our meed of notice, and indeed, admiration, to the beautiful tribe of peacocks, which, in an imposing crowd, either flocked to the porch, arranging themselves picturesquely on its stone balustrade, or disport themselves in kaleidoscopic beauty over the lawns. We are glad to be reminded, as we stand among them, that they are honored guests here, for the traditional legend says that "when the peacocks leave the lawns of Groombridge Place, the family who have so long possessed it in peace, will no longer own these historic acres."

Still hanging in the drawing room are a number of oil paintings of Philip, his first wife, Isabella Berkeley; his second wife, Sarah Isgar, his son John, and grandchildren. Elsewhere we find paintings of Philip's daughters and the children of the King of France.

The first known American descendant to visit Groombridge was Jane Linn Bright, of Philadelphia, during the tenancy of the Rev. John Saint family. In later years the Compiler of this Genealogy made several visits, followed in 1934 Florence R. (Harrison) Burgess, granddaughter of John Pettit Packer 1st., and in 1949, James Freestone, grandson of William Jefferson Packer, visited during the tenancy of H. Walton Mountain and his mother. In 1952, Mary Elizabeth (Allis), great granddaughter of Governor William F. Packer, and her husband, Dr. William Clement Eaton enjoyed the pleasure of a visit.

Donnington Castle.

Rich in English history, Donnington Castle, in the County of Berks, England, built in the 16th year of King Richard II, 1393 A.D., by Sir Richard Abberbury, is seated on an eminence and stands at a small distance from a little village of the same name. It is about a mile from Newbury and half a mile from Speenhamland, the 'Ancient Spina of Antonius.' Exclusive of the Gate house the main building was about 80 x 125 feet.

Later the property seems to have been held by the reputed son of Geoffrey Chaucer, the poet, and we find that it subsequently passed to Queen Elizabeth from the family of the Duke of Suffolk, and she, by Patent dated 1599, granted the same to the Right Hon. Charles, late Earl of Nottingham, then High Admiral of England, and to his heirs and assigns forever; and he conveyed it to the Right Hon. William, Lord of Effingham, his son; and the Earl and Countess of Peterborough, who, about June 1632, by fine and recovery, and other good conveyance in the law, for 3,648 pounds paid by John Packer, of Groombridge, Esquire, granted him and his heirs the Castle and Manor House of Donnington, together with the park and meadow called Lord's Meade, etc., then in the tenure of Smith.

For eleven years King Charles I. had tried government without the aid of Parliament. Forced loans, the imposition of ship money, Charles ill-advised action in endeavoring to secure Hampden, Pym and others who had taken an active part in opposition to him, precipitated a conflict which raged for seven years. In March 1639-40 John Packer refused to loan money to Charles, and in retaliation Donnington Castle and all his estates, excepting Groombridge, were sequestered by the King. In 1643 the Castle was fortified as a garrison for the King and the government entrusted to Colonel Boys, being a post of great importance on the high road leading from the west to London and that from Oxford to Newbury. It was twice besieged; once on the 31st of July, 1644, by Lieut. General Middleton, who was repulsed with the loss of one Colonel, eight Captains, one Serg't Major, and others.

On the 25th of October 1644, Charles had posted his army in the field in front of the Castle and Shaw House nearby; outposts being at Boxford, the ford at Shaw Bridge, and south of Newbury. On the high ground at Clay Hill and towards Ashmore Green, the Parliamentary forces were defended by a long entrenchment and battery on the summit of the hill. At Red Field on Oct. 26th a Council of War was held by the Parliamentary Generals and it was decided to make a flank march with one half of the army under Waller and Cromwell, round by Heritage to North Heath, near Chieveley. From this point they were to march to Boxford, cross the Lambourn there, and give battle to the King's left, posted near Deanswood. The other half, under the Earl of Manchester, were to attack the King's position at Shaw as soon as it was evident that the attack on Speen Hill had commenced. The Royalists were surprised by Waller at Boxford, and the outpost driven in, and by noon the Parliamentary army had gained the high ground above Speen. Later in the day, after a repulse, they stormed the entrenchments, the King's troops gave way, and the position at Speen was lost. Taking advantage of this success, Balfour's troop of horse pursued the retreating Royalists towards Newbury, and the King was nearly captured.

Although the Parliamentary army had been completely successful at Speen, the Royalists still held their fortified position at Shaw. The King, however, not knowing of the successful stand made here, returned to Donnington Castle, and after an interview with Sir John Boys, the Governor, determined on an escape to Bath, whither he proceeded accompanied by the Prince of Wales, the Earl of Lindsey and others. The army retreated in good order and the Roundheads discovered next morning that the King had made good his escape.

The Parliamentary army occupied Newbury in November 1645 and laid siege to the Castle. The King having found his way to Oxford, where a large army awaited him, determined to relieve Sir John Boys and his brave comrades, in which he was successful, and the King slept in the Castle on the night of November 9th, leaving on the 10th, Sunday, for Lambourne and Marlborough. Sir John Boys still held out successfully, and the Parliament deputed Colonel Dalbier to reduce the Castle. Large fragments of some of the shells fired into the Castle are still shown, and prove that his artillery was of no mean size. It was so well handled, as Mr. Money says in the History of Newbury, the ancient masonry came down in such masses that some of the garrison ran out into the works for shelter. Sir John Boys was so hardly pressed that, expecting no help from without, he was forced to capitulate on April 1st, 1646, surrendering the Castle and all the ordnance, arms and ammunition, the treaty being signed on the east side of the Castle in the meadow.

When a period was put to the Civil War, John Packer regained his property, pulled down the ruinous parts of the Castle, and with the materials erected the house, Donnington Castle House, to be seen in the picture down the hill from the Castle.

William (VIII, F. 8) youngest son of John Packer, evidently lived in Donnington Castle House for some time, as we find his family there in the 'Visitation of 1665-6,' when his son John was seven years old, and as the latter died young, the property passed to his uncle Robert (F. 12), who willed it to his son John (F. 13), who devised it to his son Robert (F. 14), Lord of the Manor of Chipping Sodbury, who was succeeded in the estate by his son Henry John Packer, his last male heir (F. 14). Henry John died without issue and the estate, including Bucklebury and other estates passed to his sister's son, Winchcombe Henry Hartley, who in 1779, was Member of Parliament for Berks. He died in 1794, and the proprietorship now (1953) rests in Winchcombe Henry Hartley Russell, Esq., Lord of the Manor of Bucklebury. A number of paintings of members of the Packer family are at Bucklebury and Donnington Castle House, the latter, after being vacant for nine years is now occupied.

Large portions of the ruinous walls of the Castle are still standing, and the towers, whose winding staircases have fallen to ruin, and the Gate House,

are in good condition. Great ivy vines cover much of it. In the Gate House will be found the Packer and Stephens Arms, and some of the cannon balls used in the Civil war. To the right, just after passing through the Gate House, a modern cottage has been erected.

From John Evelyn's ('Silva,' we quote - "Nor are we to overpass those memorable trees which so lately flourished in Donnington Park near Newbury; amongst which three were most remarkable from the Ingenious Planter, and didication (if tradition hold) of the famous English Bard, Geoffrey Chaucer; one of which was called the Kings, another the Queens, and a third, Chaucer's oak. The first of these was fifty foot in height before any bough or knot appeared, and cut five foot square at the butt end, all clear timber. The Queen's was felled since the wars, and held forty foot excellent timber, straight as an arrow in growth and grain, and cutting four foot at the stub and near a yard at the top, besides a fork of almost clear timber above the shaft, which was crowned with a shady tuft of boughs, amongst which, some were on each side curved like a ram's horns, as if they had been so industrially bent by hand. And this account I received from my most honored friend Philip Packer, Esq., whose father (as Lately the gentleman, his brother) was proprietor of this Park."

John⁴ Packer (Thomas 4), b. Twickenham, Middlesex, 1569, studied for a while at Cambridge, but subsequently went to Oxford, where he matriculated as a member of Trinity College on March 13, 1589-90. Under the patronage of Lord Burghley, Thomas and Richard, Earls of Dorset, and the Duke of Buckingham, he became a great favorite at court. In Vol. 3, Familiae Minorum Gentium, he is mentioned as a man very eminent for piety and wisdom, and the great patron of Dr. Preston.

On July 11, 1604, he obtained a grant in reversion of a clerkship of the Privy Seal. Writing to Sir Thomas Edmonds on Jan. 17, 1610, he states that Thomas, Lord Dorset, had asked him to be his traveling companion in France. In August 1610 he was sent as Envoy to Denmark. With Francois Godolphin he had a grant on March 23, 1614, of the office of Prothonotary of the Chancery for life; and in June 1615, he was acting as secretary to Lord Chamberlain Somerset, and was filling a similar office for Lord Buckingham in 1616. He was granted an annual pension of 115 pounds on March 7, 1617, from the Court of Wards on surrendering a life pension from the exchequer and treasury of the chamber.

As evidence of the social distinction he attained, Camden, in his Annals, says that the Marquis of Buckingham, Baron Haye, and the Countess of Dorset, were sponsors at the baptism of one of his children (Philip) in Westminster Church on June 24, 1618. He was now (1618) rich enough to buy from Lord Dorset the Manor of Groombridge, in Speldhurst, Kent, elsewhere described and pictured. In 1625 he built Groombridge Chapel in gratitude for the safe return of Charles, Prince of Wales, from Spain, on which account it was afterwards called St. Charles Chapel, and endowed with 30 pounds per annum.

Charles, pleased with his loyalty, granted him at his coronation, the Manor of Shellingford, which he had purchased in 1615 from Sir Henry Neville, where he occasionally resided. Shellingford Castle has long since been torn down, but the church stands close by some of its old vine covered walls, and contains numerous memorials to the family. He also owned an estate at Chilton Foliat, Wilts, and in 1632 purchased the Manor of Donnington, and Donnington Castle, in Shaw, Berks, near Newbury.

In 1628 he was elected Member of Parliament for West Looe, Cornwall, and in 1635 he was one of the Commissioners for investigating into the abuses of the Fleet Prison.

When Charles, in March 1639-40, asked those of his subjects on whose loyalty he thought he could rely for loans of money, Mr. Packer refused to comply with his request, and forthwith allied himself with Parliament. He may have imbibed sound constitutional notions from his friend, Sir John Eliot. His property excepting Groombridge, was thereafter sequestered by the Royalist Forces. Donnington Castle was garrisoned for the King, and withstood three sieges by the Cromwell forces.

On Nov. 19, 1641, he paid a free gift of 100 pounds for the affairs of Ireland into the Chamber of London, and was thanked for it; and on May 1, 1647, he was appointed a visitor of the University of Oxford. He is represented as being an excellent man of business. Among the Lansdowne MSS. in the British Museum, No. 693, is a neatly written book of both Greek and Latin verses composed by him while at Cambridge, entitled 'Elizabetha, sive Augustissimae Principis Encomium.' It is dedicated to Lord Burghley, whom he addresses as his 'Mnecenas.' A valuable collection of State Papers formed by him, passed, after several changes of ownership, into the hands of Mr. G. H. Fortesque, of Dropmore, Buckinghamshire. They were calendared in the Historical MSS. Commission, and a selection of them was edited by Mr. S. R. Gardner for the Camden Society in 1871 under the title of 'Fortesque Papers.'

He died in his house within the 'College of Westminster,' Feb. 15, 1649, and was buried on the 15th in the Cloister, St. Margaret's, Westminster. His Will, dated July 20, 1645, with a codicil dated May 2, 1648, was proved Nov. 27, 1649. He bequeathed St. Charles Chapel and the Groombridge estate to his son Philip; Shellingford to his son Robert; Donnington Castle and Donnington Castle House to his son William, and the Chilton Foliatt estate to his son John.

On July 13, 1613, at St. Catherine Cree Church, he m. Philippi, b. 1590, of the City of Westminster, dau. of Francis Mills, Esq., of Bittern, Southampton.

It is a lengthy document setting forth the settlement and succession of his estates, the Trustees being Henry Pye, of Great Faringdon, Berks, Samuel Whitlock, of Chilton Lodge, Wilts, and Thomas Bennett of Salthorpe, to whom he left his Manors of Shellingford Honour, and Donnington, and all the Sodburys, and Lyegrove, his mansion houses and lands of Shellingford, Donnington, and the Sodburys. He instructed them to pay his debts, funeral expenses, and legacies. Further, his estates are left to his son, Winchcombe Howard Packer for life with balance to his heirs in tail, male (the Trustees being John Jacob, of Boxwell, Gloucester, Esq., and John Freeman, of Fawley Court, Co. Oxon., Esq.) to hold for 200 years, and his son Henry Packer, and his heirs, and failing, to Robert, his third son, and his heirs, final remained to Elizabeth, his daughter. He wishes to be buried in Shellingford Church in a leaden coffin. Commission to administer was granted to Winchcombe Howard Packer., Esq., his son, July 1, 1732, and again Jan. 7, 1848 to Elizabeth, wife of David Hartley,

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Esq., his daughter, and last surviving residuary legatee.

In the letters of Jonathan Swift - August 1, 1714, from Rev. John Birch, Vicar of Wantage - "Mr. Dean. At Twelve o'clock Lord Bolingbroke's man rid (rode) through Wantage, to call Mr. Packer to London, the Queen being dead. (The Queen died that morning between seven and seven thirty o'clock). I am confounded at the melancholy news; yet could not forbear sending it to you." Your truly humble servant. Jo. Birch.

Robert and his wife were buried in Shellingford Church, Berks, where we find a mural tablet in the chancel bearing the family Arms, a Latin inscription and the following - 'A gentleman eminent for all the social and relative virtues of strict honour, unbounded generosity and extensive charity, beloved and valued by his equals honored by his greatly and universally lamented when he died (after a long and painful illness), he patiently and submissively paid to nature on the 4th day of April 1731, in the 54th year of his age.'

In the floor of the chancel we find a slab with the following - 'This marble is lay'd here in memory of my dearest friend's wife, Mrs. Mary Packer, who died Feb. 29, 1819-20, in the 37th year of her age.'

Robert married Feb. 27, 1699-00 at Bucklebury, Mary, b. Bucklebury, 1682-3, dau. and co-heiress of Sir Henry Winchcombe, Baronet, and Frances, d. Dec. 22, 1707, aet. 66 years, dau. and co-heiress of Thomas Howard, Earl of Berks, and Frances, d. Dec. 22, 1707, aet. 66, years, dau. of Sir Richard Harrison. Mary Winchcombe Packer was a sister of Frances, Lady Bolingbroke. Issue -

'Near this place lie interred the remains of Winchcombe Howard Packer, Esq., of Donnington, in this county, who died Aug. 21, 1746, aet. 44. As also of Henry Packer, Esq., who died Oct. 27, 1746, aet. 38. As also of Mr. Robert Packer, who died July 4, 1739, aet. 29. In memory of these three brothers, and of their brother, Mr. John Packer, who was unfortunately killed in the East Indies in the year 1727. This monument was erected by David Hartley and his wife, Elizabeth, their affectionate sister and only surviving offspring of Robert Packer, Esq., in the year of our Lord 1747.' From Bucklebury Church Register we quote - 1746. Winchcombe Howard Packer, Esq., was buried in Limmin Sept. 1, . He was member of Parliament for Berks, and died at his town house in Gordon Square, London. In his Will, dated March 18, 1746, he leaves his soul to God, and his body to the earth. To his brother Henry, of the Inner Temple, Esq., his Manor of Bucklebury, Shelford, otherwise Little Shefford, and house property in St. James, Westminster, and appoints his executor. Other bequests in a codicil. Will proved Sept. 3, 1746. In April 1742, from Archives at Bucklebury we find a receipt by Winchcombe Howard Packer for 4,450 pounds from his brother Henry Packer, Esq., and Mr. Thomas Lennard, out of the money arising from the sale of the Manor and advertising Shellingford, under Act of Parliament for the sale of part of the estate of the late Robert Packer, Esq., deceased father of the said W. H. Packer, which sum is to be applied to payment of the legacy of 5,000 pounds bequeathed by the said Robert to his daughter Elizabeth, now wife of David Hartley, M. D. Winchcombe Howard Packer sold Shellingford in 1738 to Sarah, Dowager Duchess of Marlboro for 8,000 pounds.

II. Henry John, of Donnington Castle House, Berks, and Lord of the Manor of Bucklebury, which he inherited from his brother above, d. Oct. 27, 1746, matriculated at Trinity College, Oxford, June 23, 1728, aged 18, , member of the Inner Temple, devised his estates to Winchcombe Henry Hartley, his sister's son.

III. Elizabeth, who m. in 1735, Dr. David Hartley, b. Luddenden, Halifax, Eng-

Philip⁵ Packer (John 8), of Moat House, Groombridge, Kent, b. June 7, and bapt. June 24, 1618, at the Collegiate Church or Abbey of St. Peters, Westminster, his sponsors being the Marquis of Buckingham, Baron Haye, and the Countess of Dorset. He matriculated at Trinity University Dec. 11, 1635, was a Barrister of the Middle Temple and one of the Fellows of the Royal Society. John Evelyn mentions him in his Diary - "July 4, 1652. I heard a sermon at Mr. Packer's Chapel at Groombridge. A pretty, melancholy place, well wooded and watered. In this house was one of the French Kings kept prisoner (the Duke of Orleans, taken at the Battle of Agincourt, IV year of King Henry V., by Richard Waller, then owner of the place. The Chapel was built by Mr. Packer's father in remembrance of the safe return of Charles, Prince of Wales, from Spain." and again - "August 6, 1674. I went to see my old friend at Groombridge, Mr. Packer, the house well built within a moat in a woody valley." Also - "Oct. 3, 1683, came to visit me my old and worthy friend, Mr. Packer, bringing with him his nephew, Berkeley, grandson of the honest Judge."

In December 1670 a warrant was issued to Philip Packer (paymaster) for 6,000 pounds on account of impaling and fencing Windsor Great Park. On May 5, 1671 a warrant for payment by Woodward and officers of the New Forest and the forest of Alseholt and East and West Beare, was issued to Philip Packer. The close connection between the Berkeleys and Philip Packer, and the deputyship of Lord John Berkeley in Ireland, induced Philip to "intend to shortly cross the seas into Ireland," as he writes, settling in Dublin, where he died Dec. 24, 1686, aged 68 years, and where letters of administration were issued after Philip Packer, formerly of Groombridge, Kent, Esq., and in England on April 26, 1687. He was buried at Groombridge, however, in the Chapel, where we find the following memorial - "In spem Resurrecionis ad aeternam vitam; Hic reponuntur Exuviae Hominis Sed Christiana, Philip Packer, Armigeri; Qui ex primis nuptiis Isabellae Roberti Berkeley Equitis auriti filiae, Sex Susepit liberos; duos filios Et quatuor filias Et Supremum diem claufie December 24, Anno Aetatis suaes 68, Annoq Dni. 1686." In his Will, dated May 20, 1684, he bequeathed Groombridge to his son John and left cash legacies to his daughters and grand children.

Philip married (1), Isabella, (twin with Margaret) bapt. at East Barnet, Herts, Aug. 18, 1631, dau. of Sir Robert Berkeley, Knight, and one of the Justices of the Kings Bench, b. 1584, d. 1656. whose monumental memorial is in Spelchley Church,

Philip⁶ Packer (Philip 15), b. Groombridge, Kent, 1664, d. Chester Co., Pa., in 1739, was the progenitor of the largest of the three branches of the Packer family embraced in this work, and with his father, went to Ireland and settled in Dublin. At the age of 19 he was apprenticed to Joseph Fisher, an old Jewry, of London, and formerly of Warmingham Parish, Cheshire, as a law clerk, for four years, for which he was to receive 50 acres of land. Joseph Fisher was a yeoman, and was born at Elton, Cheshire. He and his wife, Elizabeth, had four children, -

Moses, Joseph, Mary and Martha, who came to America with them, along with Philip, landing at Philadelphia, Pa., August 14, 1683, having crossed the ocean on the ship 'Lion' of Liverpool, John Crompton, Master. Philip lived in Philadelphia a short time, and then located at Pensauken, New Jersey, across the river from Kensington. About 1690 he moved to near the site of the present City of Princeton. He m. (1) at Philadelphia, Sept. 10, 1685, Hannah, b. June 11, 1665, dau. of James and Ann Sessions, from Witney, England, Feb. 10, 1682, who appears to have died shortly after their last child was born. Philip inherited the estate of his mother-in-law, which was granted Aug. 10, 1689. Shortly after 1800 Philip moved through the wilderness to Head of Chester, between the Bays in Maryland, and died in his 75th year after moving to Chester County. Issue -

Packer, afterwards Governor of Penna. This suit lasted more than twenty years and was finally settled in the United States Supreme Court in favor of the English Aspdens. In view of the fact that the nucleus for his fortune was furnished by Rebecca, his mother, from funds inherited from her parents, although Aspden's Will stated that after certain bequests were made, the balance of his estate was to go to his next of kin, the Packers. He was convicted of treason during the Revolutionary War after fleeing to England, and some of his property was confiscated. He was engaged in merchant shipping and owned a fleet of ships. An accounting of his estate by his executor follows -

J., near Cooper's Creek, and bapt at Christ Church, Burlington, N.J., June 29, 1707, settled near Princeton with his parents in 1710, and later moved through the wilderness to between the Bays in Maryland, called Head of Chester, where he built a grist mill bearing this name. In 1747 he moved to Pikeland, Chester Co., where he died in 1764-6, and was buried near his wife. During his later years he went about much bent, being injured in the back by a fall through a saw mill, and was struck by the pitman. In 1724 he m. Anne, b. Dublin, Ireland, circa 1690, d. circa 1785, dau. of Peter and Anne Coates, Irish Protestants. The Coates family were of Royal descent from the Percys, who were supporters of King Charles I. Job⁹ Packer (James 22) b. in the Great Valley, East Caln, Chester Co., Mar. 27, 1754, d. 1824, was a tanner in Kennett Twp. in 1781, when warrants were issued to him for 320 acres of land in Northumberland, near Muncy. In 1792 he bought 400 acres in Huntington Co., and in 1798 he moved to Bald Eagle, Clinton Co., and bought four farms, giving one to each of his sons, William and Levi. He was a private in Capt. William Fisher¹⁰ Packer (James 30), b. Howard, Pa., Apr. 2, 1807, went to Sunbury, Pa. when a young man and became associated with Simon Cameron in the newspaper business. Later he published a paper for a number of years in Harrisburg, and subsequently formed a partnership with his brothers, John P., and Hezekiah E., and constructed various public works for both the State and Federal governments. His first public office was as a member of the Legislature, and he became the Speaker of the House during his first term, an honor hitherto unknown in the annals of the State. In 1857 he was elected Governor of Penna. on the Democratic ticket, and served until 1861, when owing to declining health, he retired from public life, and returned with his family to Williamsport, where, honored and beloved by all, he died Sept. 27, 1870. In stature he was above ordinary size, being six feet in height, and weighing, while Governor, two hundred and twenty five pounds. He had blue eyes, chestnut brown hair, a fair complexion, and a capacious forehead, indicating great intellectual power. His address was frank, open and cordial, and his conversational powers pleasing and attractive. As a public speaker he had few equals - never failing to attract large audiences and to command their most profound attention. A large collection of rare coins gathered by him was lost when his mansion at Williamsport was destroyed by fire. He married, Dec. 24, 1829, Mary Wyckoff, b. Mar. 16, 1812, d. John Pettit¹⁰ Packer (James 30), b. Howard, June 4, 1809, d. at Lock Haven, Pa. Jan. 17, 1881, was one of the wealthy merchants and farmers of Centre Co., and a highly respected citizen. With his brothers, William F. and Hezekiah E., he engaged in numerous public works for the Federal and State governments. His first undertaking was the construction of the dam across the Susquehanna River at Muncy, which was followed by the dam at Lock Haven. Later he built the dam at Towanda, Pa., and the Rip Raps at the mouth of the James River in Virginia. Following this he laid the first railroad tracks into Richmond, constructed the major portion of James River and Kanawha Canal, and the Orange and Alexandria Railroad, as well as many sections of the Phila. and Erie Railroad. While engaged in large contracting enterprises, he also operated a large mill and store at Flemington, and a fleet of canal boats from Lock Haven to Phila. He was a devoutly religious man, and in addition to other philanthropies, founded the Disciple Church at Howard. During his stay in Virginia he was married in Henrico Co. by Rev. 

Very little is known of the boyhood life of Jonathan T. Packer, except that he helped his father as a tanner of hides for the making of leather. He left Ohio in May 1836 after joining the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, and came with a group to Kane Co., Missouri, having walked the entire distance of 800 miles, arriving on July 12th. Here he was first married and his first son was born. Because of their religious beliefs they were greatly persecuted, and by Oct. 1838 were driven from Missouri. His wife, Sarah died about this time, and their group moved to Nauvoo, Ill., where he married again, and three children were born. Here, persecution became so severe by 1847, that their 20,000 members were driven from their homes, and started the migration into the unknown, unconquered, yet free from persecution West. They had a yoke of oxen and one of cows, providing milk which many did not have. Even with two wagons it was necessary for the young to walk across the plains. Jonathan was one of the drivers of four teams entering Salt Lake Valley Aug. 31, 1848, and his son William Jefferson was one of the first children born there. On May 1, 1883, he came to Arizona to help colonize and settle, where he died at Safford. His son, Alonzo, walked from Illinois to Salt Lake City, and the soles of his feet were so toughened that he could strike a spark by rubbing them together. He was then only seven years old.

The families of Alonzo Hamilton Packer and William Jefferson Packer were among the first settlers in Graham Co., Arizona. Lorenzo Wright, son-in-law of Jonathan Taylor Packer, and his son were killed by the Apache Indians soon after the arrival of their families in 1886.



tract. In 1851 he purchased the entire stock of the Lehigh Valley Railroad, and

William Packer (fl. 1644-1660) soldier, entered the Parliamentary Army early in the Civil War in England, and was a lieutenant in Cromwell's 'Ironsides' in 1644. In the spring of that year he was placed under arrest by Major General Crawford for disobedience to orders, but obtained his release by the intervention of Cromwell. Cromwell had explained to Crawford that "he did ill in checking such a man, which was not well taken, he being such a godly man." (Manchester's quarrel with Cromwell, Camden Soc. 1875, p. 59.)

Carlyle supposee Packer to be the officer referred to in Cromwell's letter of the 10th March, 1643-4, but that officer was a lieutenant Colonel. (Cromwell letter 20.) In 1646 Packer was a Captain in Fairbanks Regiment of horse (Spriggs, Anglia Redwiva, ed. 1854, p. 331). He aided with the army in its quarrel with the Parliament, and was present at the siege of Cochester in 1648. At the Battle of Dunbar he seems to have commanded Cromwells own regiment of horse in the absence of its Major, and taken part in that flank attack on the Scottish Army which decided the issue of the battle.

In 1652 Packer became Major of the regiment, and as such was Colonel in all but name, receiving the salary and exercising all the functions of the office on behalf of Cromwell. He was still noted for his godliness, and on the 17th July, 1653, received a license from the Council of State authorizing him to preach in any pulpit in England.

In 1656 he acted as Deputy Major General for Buckinghamshire, Oxfordshire and Hertfordshire, and had the honor of proceeding against Edmund Waller until the Protector interfered in behalf of the poet. Several of his letters concerning his proceedings in this office are printed among Thurloe's Papers.

When Lambert escaped from the Tower of London, Packer was imprisoned, seized and committed to prison April 15, 1660. The restoration of the King entailed upon him the loss of his properties, and though he escaped punishment, the government of King Charles II. considered him dangerous, and more than one arrested him on suspicion of plots.

His wife, Elizabeth, petitioned for his release in August 1661, stating that he had been confined in the Gate House for three months. No further record.

1941

When William the Conqueror divided the lands of conquered England amongst his Norman favorites, the account of the survey was written in a 'Domesday Book,' or Book of Judgement, which is preserved in the Tower of London.

1066 A. D., William, the Norman, conquered the English at Hastings, and afterwards compiled the Domesday Book, wherein is "the Church of St. Mary at Glastonbury holds Mildenhall and Edward under the church. Heretofore Hugolinus held it. It was in the time of Edward, the Confessor, in the hands of the abbot and assessed at ten hides, - here are ten ploughlands - four of the hides are in demesne, where are two ploughlands. Fifteen villagers and five borderers occupy four ploughlands. The mill pays thirty shillings, and here are ten acres of meadow."

The pasture is three quarters of a mile long and three furlongs broad. Here is the same quantity of wood. It was valued at twelve pounds, now (time of William the Norman) at eighteen pounds."

At Marlborough, A. D. 1267, Henry III held a Parliament or General Assembly of the estates of England, for the better state of the realm and the more speedy administration of justice."

In 1275 A. D. Ralph De Mildhale mentioned in the Rotuli Hundredorum in the inquisition taken at Marlborough.

A. D. 1301 Sir John De Mildenhale, Knight, presented a clerk to the Rectory of Mildenhale, near Marlborough.

Sixth year of Edward II, 1313 A. D., Geffrey De Mildenhale, John De Mildenhale, Lerour, with many others, accompanied the King to foreign parts beyond the sea. Letters of protection and attorney were issued to many who were about to accompany the King into France. Among the rest, to Majester Johannes de Mildenhall of Wilts. John de Mildenhale, third year of Edward III, 1330 A. D., held fifty acres of Wyndsoe Forest.

In the twelfth year of Edward III, A. D. 1339, (invasion of France) - letters of protection given to many gentlemen, among them being Thomas de Mildenhale and John de Mildenhale, who were about to go in company with Phillippe, Queen of England, into foreign parts beyond the sea.

A. D. 1347, 20th year of Edward III. the King confirmed to John de Mildenhale in fee 58½ acres of woodland in the Forest of Wyndsoe in consideration of 18 shillings, 6 pence per annum. The King issues a warrant for the delivery of 200 bows and 400 quivers of arrows to Robert de Mildenhale, nostro delicto clericu, for services in the French War.

A. D. 1348, 21st year of Edward III, this same Robert, our beloved clerk, appears as keeper of the jewels in the Tower, and is directed by the King to deliver two chests of ornaments to be taken to Calais to be used for the service in the chapel on the ensuing feast of Easter.

Another warrant to deliver 1940 quivers of arrows to Robert de Mildenhale at the Tower of London, 24th year of Edward III, 1351 A.D. A. D. 1355, 28th year of Edward III, a warrant directing Richard de Mildenhale to make enquiry respecting a standard of measures, and in 1356 Edmund de Mildenhale gave to a certain chaplain certain lands with appurtenances in Mildenhale, Co. Suffolk.

John Mildenhall was Prior of St. Mary, Bethlehem, 11th year of Richard II, 1388 A. D. In 1599 A. D. John de Mildenhall was sent overland by the route of Constantinople on an embassy to the Great Mogul.

Moses Mildenhall, of the Parish of Rensby, County of Wilts, received of John Ewen, of Marridge Hill, 500 acres to be laid in Pennsylvania, and is so laid under William Penn, 5th day of September, 1685.

John Mendenhall is believed to have come to Chester County Pennsylvania, at or about the same time as Moses Mendenhall.

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In 1918 research on the Wiltbank family was started by Annie Elizabeth (Lund) Marble, and in 1921 the Spencer Watson Wiltbank Organization was formed, with Spencer Sanders Wiltbank as President. He was the stimulating influence for many years. The first historians of the organization were Effie B., wife of George Wiltbank, and Ellis Wiltbank. Through the efforts of Josephine W. Hamblin, the connection to the Mendenhall family was established. Many of the family have given their time and means to the collection of the data. Effie B. Wiltbank, historian, and Geneva P. Wiltbank, genealogist, assisted by Eva Willama H. Ashcroft, the history and records have been brought up to date. Jane Lay Roundy and Sarah Ida Wiltbank Foremaster, have been the most active in collecting the records of the Utah branch of the family.

The Wiltbank Family Organization, and their officers, below, are the sponsors of this Genealogy, and the Packer Family Association, through John Thurber Packer, President and Genealogist, welcomes the joining of these two pioneer American families in permanently preserving for posterity, a record of all the fine qualities inherent in each.

Halmanus Frederick Wiltbank, known until circa 1750 as Wiltbanch, was born in Sweden circa 1640, is believed to have settled temporarily in Holland before coming to America. There are several different traditions concerning his coming to Delaware. One version (Lyman P. Powell; the History of Education in Delaware, 25, Wiltbank settled at Lewes about 1650, when it was but an Indian village, and soon thereafter donated a lot for a school house. According to another, Halmanus Frederick Wiltbank came to New York from Holland about 1650, later received a grant of land from the Duke of York, and sailed for Sussex County, Delaware. The vessel was wrecked off the coast. Wiltbank, his wife and two sons were saved, also his man servant and a child who was so young that she was unable to tell her name or that of her parents. (Old Philadelphia Families, in the North American (newspaper) issue of Mar. 16, 1913, page 6.)

According to another account, Halmanus Wiltbank emigrated from Sweden about the year 1650. Tradition says that the vessel in which he had embarked was wrecked off Cape Henlopen, and that he saved himself by swimming ashore, carrying in his pocket a silver watch which has been handed down from father to son, and is still in the possession of his descendants. His name is found on many legal papers of that period, such as the Duke of York Record, and many surveys of land, showing that he was prominent in Governmental affairs.

A deposition has been discovered showing his age as about 40 years in 1681, and as designating his position in March 1676-7 as President of the Sussex County Court. (Kent County Court record; 1680, 82, p.p. 44-45, in Hall of Records, Dover, Delaware. It is certain that he was known as Halmanus Frederickson at the Whorekills in our earliest mention of him in extant records, and that he seems to have been well established there before the surrender of the Dutch to the English in 1664. If he was the first of the settlers there, he certainly was the

leading citizen by 1669 - he may have come by 1658 when trade with the Indians was officially resumed. (Penn. Gen. Mag., Dec. 1950, Vol. 18, No. 1,, by John Goodwin Herndon). As a young man he was a fisherman on the Delaware River, and later on the Mississippi River, when he met two missionaries of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints. He joined this church and was a member of the Nauvoo Legion. In the spring of 1848 he started west in a company headed by Brigham Young, which included 2400 souls, 792 wagons, and large herds of cattle and horses. They arrived in the Salt Lake valley in September 1848. It was on this long trek that he met the girl who was to become his wife, Annie Sanders, aged 16, who drove a mule team across the plains. She was a fearless woman, and was always kind to the Indians, but when they became troublesome drove them from her door with a broom. The Wiltbank family lived in the Salt Lake valley about ten years before moving to Farmington, and then later to St. George to raise cane and cotton, where they lived about twenty years. In the spring of 1879 he and his son Ellis left for Arizona, and upon his return in the fall, found that his wife had died in June. He had located a home in Arizona and in the spring of 1880 started back to Arizona with his four motherless children, the youngest aged seven years. They were accompanied by his daughter, Elizabeth and her husband and two small children. The Lunds stopped off at Snowflake for the winter. They arrived at Round Valley Dec. 4, 1880, and built the first log cabin at Amity, later named Colter. Issue -
