

JSTOR holdings and the Linderman closing

For a number of years, Lehigh has participated in the JSTOR project, which offers hundreds of full text journal backfiles in many fields, with an excellent concentration in the humanities. JSTOR titles are invariably **digitized back to volume 1**, so that the entire run of any included title is available, with the exception of the most recent years. A “moving wall” is established for each included journal, so that the publisher can continue to receive revenue for current volumes of the publication. After the embargo period (3 to 5 years), the volume is folded into JSTOR.

In summer 2005 LTS added several new JSTOR collections, anticipating the need to add new backruns as soon as they emerge, in order to assist our readers during the Linderman renovation project. Lehigh is now a participant in the Arts & Sciences I, II, III, and IV Collections, the Arts & Sciences Complement and the General Science Collection.
