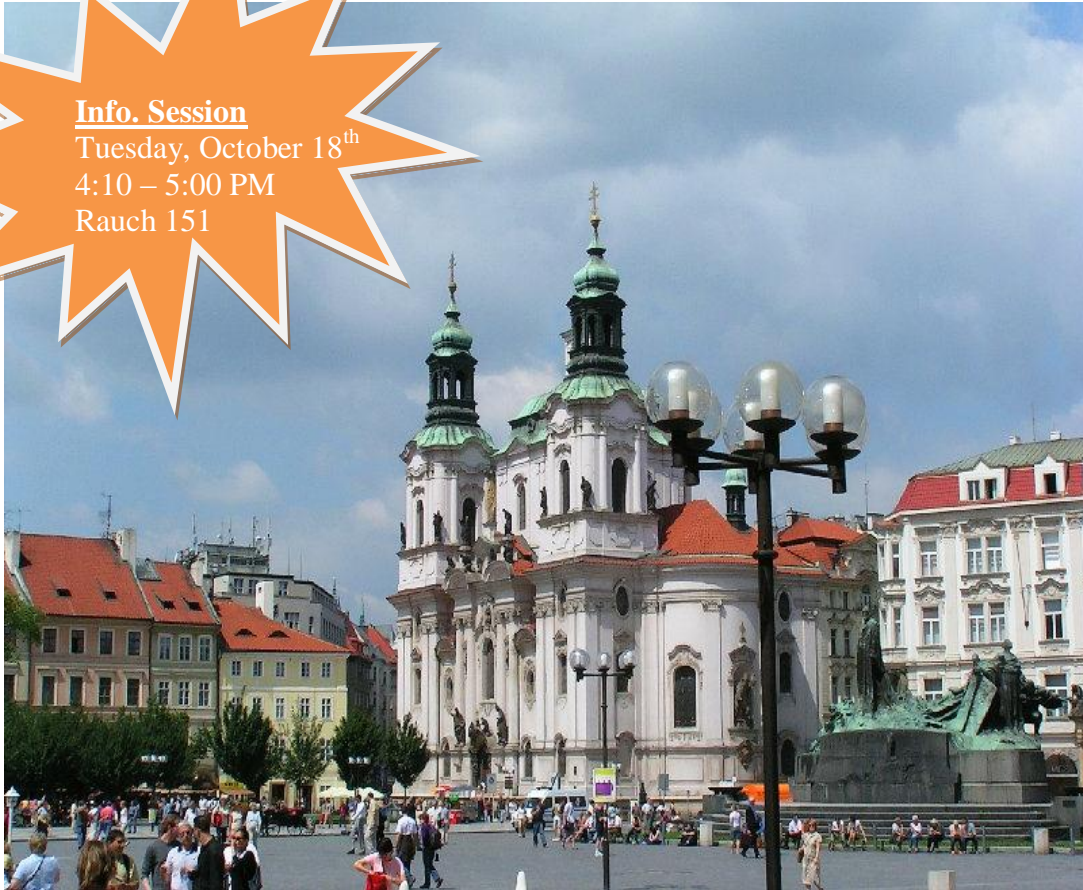

**Program Objective:** Learn professional and personal requirements to be effective in international business.

### **Courses expected in Prague for Summer, 2012:**

- All students must register for two courses (6 credits). Each student must take CSB 314 and either CSE 252 or International Business in an Integrated Europe.
- Courses are taught in English. Knowledge of the Czech language is not required.
- If necessary, a waiting list will be established for courses.
- All applicants must submit a resume with their application.

#### **CSB 314: International Practicum (3 credits)**

This practicum course provides an opportunity for students to work on an intensive consulting engagement with a business. Students work with client firms on individual or team projects which focus on activities in information systems, accounting, finance, or economics. Requires written report(s) and a formal presentation. *Prerequisite: Economics 1*

**NOTE:** Some practicums for Lehigh in Prague 2011 may have prerequisites at the major course level.

#### **Management 372-11 or Economics 371-10: International Business in an Integrated Europe (3 credits)**

An analysis of strategic and operational responses by international firms to European political and economic integration and adoption of the Euro currency. Student project teams will analyze the transition process currently underway in key European industries and firms. Project report, presentation, and discussion. This course is a free elective but does not apply towards the management major. *Prerequisite: Economics 1.* This course must also be paired with CSB 314.

#### **CSE 252: Computers, the Internet and Society (3 credits)**

##### **Required CSB course**

An interactive exploration of the current and future role of computers, the Internet, and related technologies in changing the standard of living, work environments, society and its ethical values. Privacy, security, depersonalization, responsibility, and professional ethics; the role of computer and Internet technologies in changing education, business modalities, collaboration mechanisms, and everyday life. (SS) This course must also be paired with CSB 314.

### **Location and Travel:**

Our dormitory is run by Charles University (founded in 1348) and is located on a tram line that connects to the Metro, Prague's subway system. Historical sites, shopping streets, restaurants, theaters, concert halls, and jazz clubs are conveniently available. Given the central location of Prague, weekend travel to other European destinations is possible by bus, rail, or discount airline. The dorm, Komenskeho Kolej, has double occupancy rooms with usually two bedrooms sharing a bathroom.

Our planned departure is from Newark International Airport on Thursday, May 24, 2012. The Study Abroad Office will notify the students of the faculty flights for the program. Students will be responsible for booking their own outbound travel and we highly recommend that they travel on the same flight(s) as the faculty. Return travel should be any time on June 23, 2012 or later.
