Origin of Polities Data

Data values: Independence date Data values: Origin, Colonial power Conceptual scheme and coding rules

Previous studies have suggested that former British colonies inherit unique pre-democratic political institutions and/or political culture. The length of the independence period has also been postulated as a source of stability in political forms. To test these (and related) ideas, date of independence and certain aspects of the origin of each polity was coded from CIA World Factbook (http://www.odci.gov/cia/publications/factbook/index.html)

Date of independence was coded verbatim; exceptions noted at bottom of file.

Origin and predecessor of polities was coded principally from parenthetical notes following independence date by investigators Ahearn (Asia), Belcak (Africa), Coyle (Europe), McLaughlin (MiddleEast) and Vazquez (Western Hemisphere), circa 11-16 November 1999. Original coding forms, which also include notes on religion, language, and ethnic groups (not further described herein or coded) are stored on the project web. Coding rules and questionable decisions were discussed and adopted at subsequent project meetings.

Rules were formulated to capture concepts related to the postulate that a nation's political institutions are, inter alia, a function of (1) the political institutions implanted immediately prior to and at the founding of the polity, and (2) the elapsed time since independence. The founding institutions are postulated to be those of the predecessor polity at the independence date. For most nations, the predecessor is a colonial master or an earlier polity from which the later one is derived. Specific coding rules follow. Time since independence will be modelled as a decay function, the form of which to be subsequently determined by empirical test of *a priori* parabolic assumption.

Specific coding rules

1. A polity originating prior to the period coded by the Polity III project (1800) is categorized as an ancien regime (99). If colonial effects decay parabolically as postulated, little relevant information is lost by ignoring earlier origins. As a practical matter, earlier origins are subject to wide interpretation and no codings are available for those predecessor polities. The predicted DEMO21 at founding for these nations is yet to be determined (possibilities are -10 to reflect prevailing autocracy or a neutral code or a dummy). Known exceptions: (1) US is coded as British colony and assigned UK's DEMO21 as of 1800; Liberia is coded as a "new polity" (98), but assigned US's DEMO21 of 1837 to reflect its special role.

2. A polity is coded as a colony of the power from which it received independence on the given date. The predecessor polity is that colonial master and the founding DEMO21 prediction is that of the colonial power on that date. Exceptions: see 3. below

3. If the final colonial period lasted 15 years or less, a prior colonial master or polity will be considered the predecessor.

4. A polity formed by a split of a predecessor polity is considered a new polity (90) (it is not coded as a colony), but its founding DEMO21 is that of the predecessor. An ex-colony is distinguished from a new polity only with difficulty. Generally, a colony (a) is clearly subordinate in power, (b) has political institutions imposed upon it, (c) is governed as an autonomous unit, and (d) was incorporated by force. Generally, a polity deriving from a split lacks two or more of these attributes. Specific cases: most of the former Soviet Republics are coded as ex-colonies, principally because they were acquired by conquest. Russia, Belarus, and Ukraine are coded as splits, having been part of the Russian Empire before 1800 and having substantial populations willingly part of the USSR. Those former parts of the Ottoman Empire predominantly Muslim were coded as splits; non-Muslims as ex-colonies.

5. A polity formed by a merger of predecessors may be treated as a new polity or a continuation of one of the old ones. Coding will follow the Polity III decision. If it is a continuation, the merger is treated as a non-event and the independence date and predecessor is inherited. If it is a new polity (91), it will be assigned the DEMO21 of the dominant predecessor, indicated by the new capital if no judgement of dominance can be made.

6. If the predecessor has a DEMO21 missing data code (interruption, interegnum, etc.) as of the independence date of the new polity, the assigned DEMO21 for the

new polity is the most recent previous non-missing DEMO21 codeof the predecessor.

Exceptions to general coding procedures: Date of independence

255 Germany/Prussia: the relevant date is not Factbook's 18 January 1871 because that polity ended before the time period of our study. The current Germany (255) was born 40ctober 1990. The predecessor state is the Federal Republic.

305 Austria: Factbook gives 1156, but Polity III gives 1918. 310 Hungary: Factbook gives 1001, but Polity III gives 29 May 1867. Since P3 lists both 300 (Austria-Hungary) and 310 with identical scores from 1867 to 1918, our study codes the origin with the 1918 date that coincides with the demise of 300.

630 Iran: Factbook gives 1979, but P3 lists 630 Iran/Persia as existing from 1800. P3 is more consistent with other codings.

713 Taiwan: Factbook gives 1911 (Chinese nationalist revolution), but P3 uses 1949. Japan exerted colonial power for first half of 20th century.

Exceptions to general coding procedures: Predecessor states

325 Italy P3 codes Italy/Sardinia from 1815, so 325 is both polity and predecessor polity.


