This event will showcase a panel focusing on **Security Issues of Climate Change** and specific sessions on with presentations on new products or services in the following areas:

Cyber Security and Network Centric Computing

Each session will include presentation of three papers and interactive discussion of the topic and presentations. Posters on Security Issues of Climate Change are also welcome.

DEADLINE FOR POSTERS: March 31 at 7 pm EST, for the abstracts (by email), posters (by paper mail), and registration fee for non attendees. Sending preliminary information on your intention to submit an abstract/poster is strongly encouraged but is not obligatory.

TECHNICAL DETAILS: No personal attendance is needed. The posters sent by mail will be displayed/exhibited by organizers on behalf of the authors. Non-attendees can receive some feedback from other participants by email. The best posters presented (including those sent by mail) will receive honorary certificates. Posters should either measure 2” horizontal and 3” vertical or 3” horizontal and 2” vertical.
