FOCUS THE NATION

Focus the Nation is a national university-based effort on January 31, 2008 intended to increase environmental awareness amongst students, faculty, and staff. The Environmental Coalition has proposed that professors each use the first 5-10 minutes of class on January 30/31 to explore the environmental aspects of the course subject. Environmental issues appear across all studies, and this discussion should not be limited to certain departments. Other activities include a "Green Out" (**wear green on Thursday!**), a webcast, and a panel discussion.

A webcast will be held on **Wednesday, January 30th at 8pm in Sinclair Auditorium** on "The 2% Solution." The webcast will revolve around the question: can we as a nation get on to a sustainable path, and cut global warming pollution 2% a year for the next decade? **On Thursday, January 31st at 4:10pm in Sinclair Auditorium** there will be a follow-up panel discussion of the webcast and how both Lehigh University and the city of Bethlehem can contribute to this goal. “Confronting Oppression with Violence: A Dynamic, Continuous-Time Analysis of the Relationship between Collective Action and State Repression.”

Jan. 30 – 4:00-5:30 – Maginnes 101

Ortiz addresses the dynamics of the relationship between state repression and collective popular actions through time using event history analysis techniques. He will explain his cross-national analysis, which covers more than 30 countries (mainly in Europe and the Americas) and produces a time-dependent model that is essential to fully explain the complexities of the collective action-repression dyad as a highly dynamic process. He focuses on how differences in the magnitude and form of repression affect the incidence of collective action.

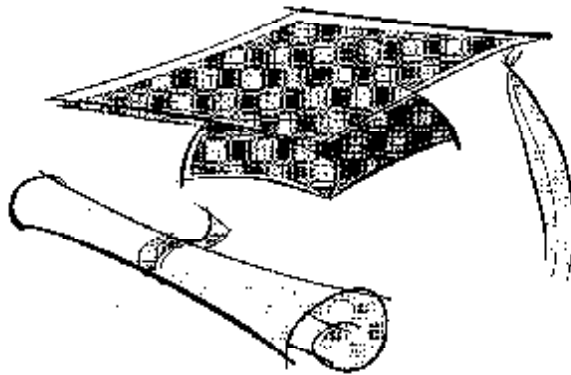
