IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ALL EMPLOYEES

HEALTHCARE PROVIDER PANEL FOR WORK-RELATED INJURIES

If you are injured while at work, Lehigh has arranged for the payment of your workers' compensation benefits with **THE PMA INSURANCE GROUP**.

It is your responsibility to immediately report the injury to your supervisor or the Risk Management Office (610-758-3899) within 24 hours of the injury.

Workers' Compensation insurance is a statutory program that provides medical coverage and, in some instances, income maintenance to employees who are disabled as a result of a work-related injury or illness. All full-time and part-time faculty, staff, and student employees (salaried or on wages) are eligible for workers' compensation coverage.

IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PENNSYLVANIA WORKERS' COMPENSATION ACT, YOU MUST CHOOSE A PHYSICIAN OR OTHER HEALTH CARE PROVIDER FROM THE LIST BELOW.

IN CASE OF WORK-RELATED INJURY OR DISEASE

If you suffer a work-related injury, PMA will pay for reasonable surgical and medical services, medicines, supplies, orthopedic appliances and prostheses, including training in their use. In order to ensure that your medical treatment will be paid for by PMA, you must select from one of the physicians or other health care providers as listed below.

- You must continue to visit to one of these physicians or other health care providers listed above, if you need treatment, for 90 days from the date of your first visit. After this 90-day period, if you still need treatment, you may choose to go to another physician or other health care provider for treatment. If this situation should arise, let your employer and your PMA Claims Representative know within 5 days of the first visit.
- All physicians and other health care providers must file reports within 10 days after your first visit and at least once a month for as long as treatment continues in order for payment to be considered.
- If one of the physicians or other health care providers listed above refers you to another physician or health care provider, your employer or his insurer will pay the reasonable bills for these services.

If you're faced with an **immediate medical emergency**, you may secure initial assistance from a hospital, physician or other health care provider of your choice. You must then seek subsequent treatment from a physician or other health care provider listed above for at least the first 90 days from the date of your first treatment.

If one of the listed providers recommends invasive surgery, you are entitled to a second opinion from a physician of your choice. Should your physician's opinion differ, and you choose that opinion, the panel physician will bide by same for 90 days.

Any person knowingly and with intent to defraud any insurance company or other person files an application for insurance or statement of claim containing any materially false information or conceals for the purpose of misleading, information concerning any fact materials thereto commits a fraudulent insurance act, which is a crime and subjects such person to criminal and civil penalties.
