Below is a brief update on the Library Drive Project, which was part of the Campus Master Plan to make the center of the campus more pedestrian-friendly and to enhance the sense of place.

In anticipation of the beginning of a new academic year, the following traffic changes will become effective Friday, August 14th, weather permitting:

- Memorial Drive will return to one way east from Brodhead Avenue, heading in past the north side of the Alumni Memorial Building until it intersects with University Drive. University Drive will become one way south, looping up past Library Drive to Brodhead Avenue. The short stretch of University Drive from Brodhead Avenue to the upper entrance to the Alumni Building Parking Pavilion will remain two-way to accommodate access to parking from Brodhead. A striped walking path will be painted along the north curb line of University Drive from the parking pavilion to Library Drive to enhance pedestrian safety.

Note: Access to Memorial Drive from Brodhead Avenue will be restricted to authorized vehicles and vehicles with handicapped permits needing access to Linderman Library.

- Cars may exit and enter the upper entrance of the Alumni Parking Pavilion. However, exiting cars must turn right onto Brodhead Avenue.

- Vehicular access to Library Drive will be restricted ONLY to authorized vehicles and vehicles bearing handicapped permits.

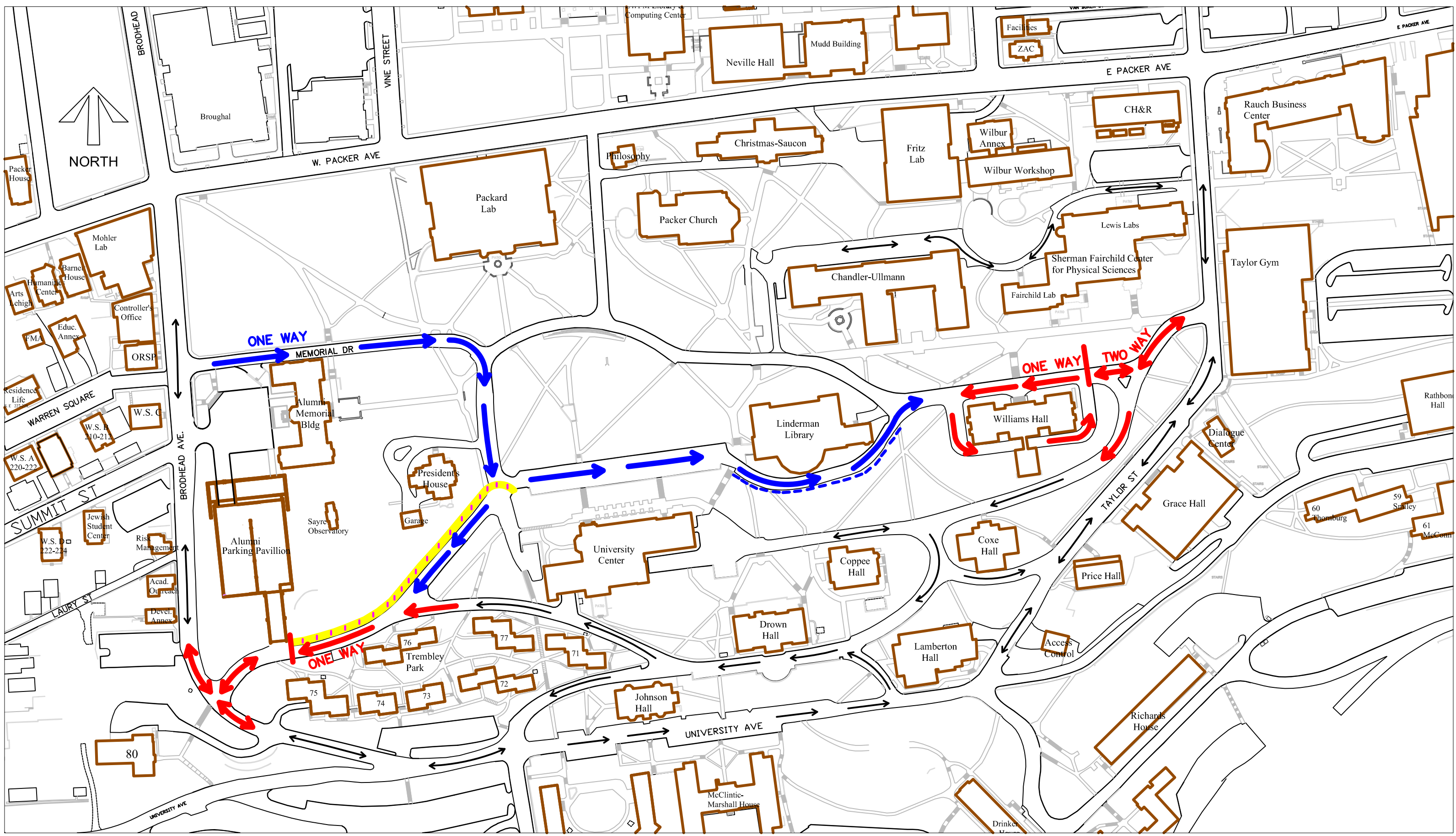
- Handicapped parking will be located on the road directly south of and adjacent to the Linderman Library Rotunda.

- Access to parking at Williams Hall will be from Taylor Street, exiting back to Taylor Street by looping one-way to the south, around Williams Hall.

Please note that these changes will be enforced for the safety of our students, faculty, staff, and visitors. While it is our intent to place signage and street level guidance by August 13th, it may be necessary to adjust and add signage as needed.
